<p>Provides considerable flexibility with the application of the concept of substantial equivalence to the requirements in Part A, as well as flexibility arising from the inclusion of many formerly mandatory requirements in the non-mandatory Guidelines in Part B of the MLC, 2006, Code, which nevertheless must be given due consideration.</p>	<p>Considers all items included in ILO MLC 2006, Title 3, Part A (Mandatory Requirements) and in addition, all items in Part B (Guidelines) are treated as requirements stipulating full compliance. In addition, the MLC-ACCOM notation includes some of additional requirements (beyond what is required by Part A & Part B of ILO MLC 2006).</p>
<p>Contains several vaguely worded requirements relating to ventilation, heating, lighting, vibration & noise providing no quantitative requirements</p>	<p>Provides specific criteria (which are based on international standards) for compliance with ILO MLC 2006 subjective (qualitative) requirements</p>
